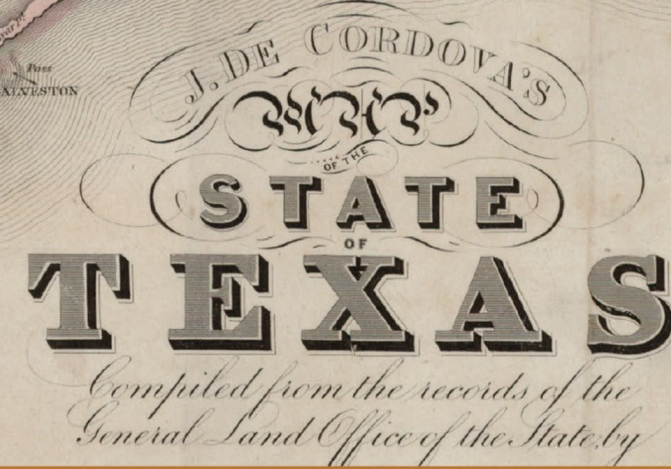




Call for Presentations: Undergraduate & Graduate Students

What: Student Research Showcase: “New Directions in Texas and Borderlands History”

Why: To promote new historical research on Texas and the borderlands, and to recognize and provide professional development opportunities for emerging scholars

The Texas General Land Office is pleased to announce the fourth installment of its **Student Research Showcase, New Directions in Texas and Borderlands History**, which it will convene as part of the Save Texas History Symposium in Austin, TX, September 6-7, 2024. We invite undergraduate and graduate students in history and related fields to deliver short (approximately 15-minute) talks on their research and its contribution to the field of Texas/borderlands history.

Presentations that address this year’s symposium theme, *Cartographic Frontiers: Putting Texas on the Map*, are especially welcome, though we will consider papers on any aspect of Texas and/or borderlands history. Presentations should be geared toward a general audience of Texas history enthusiasts, genealogists, teachers, and public history professionals.

The eight (8) selected participants will receive a \$250 honorarium and free admission to the full proceedings of the Save Texas History Symposium, including the main symposium events on Saturday, September 7, and a closing reception on Saturday evening. This is a great opportunity for students to discuss their work with an audience of non-specialists and network with established scholars in attendance.

For consideration, students should submit a 150-200 word abstract and CV to archives@glo.texas.gov with the subject heading “Student Research Showcase” by **March 31, 2024**. We will notify candidates of the results of the CFP by April 22, 2024.
